

EVERETT E. HAVENS

Everett Ellsworth Havens, who retired in North Haven six years ago died in Southampton hospital, Friday, Dec. 21st. He had been ill six weeks.

Born in Sag Harbor June 19th, 1893, he was the son of Arthur M. and Emma Corwin Havens. He was the grandson of Jacob Havens, one of the last whaling captains of Sag Harbor, when it was a famous whaling port. He attended Union School here. In 1950 Mr. and Mrs. Havens bought a home on North Haven and became permanent residents there. He previously resided in Springfield Gardens. Mr. Havens was a machinest by trade.

Among his survivors are his wife, the former Jennie Dillon, whom he married in 1919; two daughters, Mrs. Janet Butts and Mrs. Virginia Babcock; two sisters, Goldie Harris and Grace Cleveland, all of this village. Four grandchildren also survive.

A Presbyterian funeral service was conducted Sunday afternoon at 2:30 by the Rev. George A. Wilson. Burial was in Oakland cemetery.

Serving as pallbearers were Arthur B. Cleveland, Frank E. Harris, Barton Cleveland, Oscar Havens, Paul Babcock and Alfred D. Butts.
